### **COURSE WEIGHTING:**

GPA is computed at the end of the 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades. The GPA will be calculated through the following methods:

Unweighted GPA: No weighting will be applied.

SY 2023/2024 and Prior - Weighted GPA: GPA is weighted using a multiplier. College Preparatory courses are assigned a weight of 1.03 quality points; Honors courses are assigned a weight of 1.05; Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses are assigned a weight of 1.07.

SY 2024/2025 and Beyond - Weighted GPA: Honors courses are assigned +0.5 quality points. Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses are assigned +1.0 quality points. This weighting applies to grades of C- or better. Grades of D+, D, and F are not weighted - courses where these grades are earned will not receive additional quality points.
