Clayton Elementary Before and After School Care

The goal of the program is to provide a comprehensive childcare program after school hours for children to meet the needs of working parents. The program features enhanced instructional strategies, life enhancing programs, in addition to character and value development experiences. These programs support students by developing their values, skills, and selfesteem. A nutritious snack and drink is provided each day. All children must become a member of the Smyrna/Clayton Boys & Girls Club, and the annual membership fee is due at the time of registration. State Purchase of Care is accepted. Additional fees are required on school days off and half days. Registration information is available in the CES main


Dear Students/Parents/Guardians,

Information from our Reading Specialist

One of the best things you can do to support your child's reading development is to read to him or her daily. Often pairing it with something else that is done daily helps to make sure it isn't forgotten. For example, read before going to bed or after dinner. As children get older, they can read to you, too! Above all, enjoy the time together!

Here are some more activities to practice reading skills:

Sounds:

- * Say or sing nursery rhymes
- * What word doesn't rhyme with the others? Hat, cat, bed
- * Blend sounds /b/ +/a/ +/t/ = bat
- * Segment sounds bat = /b/ + /a/ + /t/

Letters:

- * Go Fish game with letters
- * "Memory" game with letters (Put pairs of letters face down. Pick two cards at a time to try and make a match.)
- * Magnetic letters on the refrigerator
- * Make letters out of play dough

Fluency:

- * Reread a sentence or paragraph several times using expression
- * Use a timer and try to get faster each time
- * Practice and read aloud with books on tape (these can often be checked out from the library)

Comprehension:

- * Ask questions about characters, where the story is taking place, and what the problem/solution is
- * Have your child support their answers with evidence from the text
- Look at and discuss charts, timelines, and captions

SMYRNA ELEMENTARY IMPORTANT **ARRIVAL / DISMISSAL INFORMATION FOR** 2019/20

As we embark on the start of a new school year in a few short weeks, we want to briefly describe the arrival and dismissal routines, in addition to some significant changes for our returning families for non-bus-riding students at Smyrna Elementary

For 2019/20, there are only four (4) ways to travel to/from Smyrna Elementary School:

Bus

Car-rider (through the lane on South Street)

Daycare van (same location as car-riders)

Walker (will dismiss near the intersection of School Ln and South St, just like 2018/19).

The major difference is that there will be no area for walkers to be checked out as in years past. Walkers will simply check out with a staff member, and exit the building.

MORNING ARRIVAL @ 8:20am

• CAR-RIDERS AND DAYCARE VANS (ARRIVAL) NO CHANGE

As has been the routine for the past few years, ALL students arriving in cars will be dropped off in a single-file line, greeted by staff stationed at the South street entrance outside the gym and cafeteria lobby. Please note: There is no staff on supervisory duty until 8:15am. Please do not drop your student(s) off without the presence of school staff. WALKERS (ARRIVAL)

No students will be permitted to enter the building via the School Lane entrance(s). Parents may not park their vehicles on School Lane or Kent Way and drop their student off to enter the school. If students arrive in a car, they should be dropped off as part of the car-rider arrival procedure (see above). If students walk to school—either accompanied or unaccompanied—they should enter either on the Main Office side of the building, or through the gym/cafeteria lobby each morning.

AFTERNOON DISMISSAL @ 3:20pm

CAR-RIDERS (DISMISSAL)

In an effort to streamline and more efficiently dismiss our large number of car-riding students in the afternoon, we will be loading cars in a double-file line at the exit on South Street, outside the gym and cafeteria lobby—instead of merging to a single file. In the long run, this should certainly help the timeliness of the car-rider line. For safety's concern, the one thing that will change is, that under no circumstances will cars in line pull out ahead of cars who are actively loading students.

WALKERS (DISMISSAL)

Students will still be checked out and sent on their way by a staff member in Room 310 (classroom nearest the corner to intersection of School Lane and South Street). They must cross solely using the crossing guard posted at the intersection of School Lane and South Street, or by the staff member located at the entrance to the bus lane and Frazier Street. There will be no staging area for "walkers" to be checked out by an adult or sibling.

Smyrna Elementary School Changes to the **Child Nutrition Program**

For the 2019/2020 school year, Smyrna Elementary no longer qualifies as a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school. This is the program that allowed all students to receive both free breakfast and lunch at school. 11:00am Early Childhood Morning Pick-Up 3:20-3:30pm Afternoon Pick-Up

3:30-3:35pm Early Childhood Afternoon Pick-Up

- In the morning, there will be a single file line for drop off. Please pull up as far as possible. Staff is there if your child requires assistance. Please DO NOT GET OUT OF YOUR CAR.
- In the afternoon, there will be a double car line. Staff will be there to direct the two lanes into a single one for loading purposes. The staff member will alternate between the double lines, five cars at a time. Please fill both lines and go to the shorter one upon arrival.
- Drivers should pull as far up the sidewalk loading zone as possible in order to load/unload the maximum number of students at one time.
- Drivers must stay with their vehicle at all times. Students will walk to the car when it stops in the loading/unloading zone.
- If you would like to walk your child to the door or greet your child at the end of the day, please park at Municipal Park across the street and walk over to the exit.
- Early Childhood Parents/Guardians: Your children come to the front doors of the school at 3:30pm. Please wait at the municipal Park until buses 103 & 104 pull into the driveway. After they pull into the driveway you can pull in behind the buses and form two lines. You will need to walk to the front doors to greet your child. Please note, if you pull in before the buses arrive you will be required to go through the K-3 car rider lane. Thank you for your support as we work to make dismissal and drop-off safe for our students and efficient for our parents/guardians.

WHAT'S CHANGING FOR THE 2019/2020 SCHOOL YEAR

- The schools affected are North Smyrna Elementary, Smyrna Elementary and John Bassett Moore (JBM).
- The Smyrna School District will have one school that qualifies for CEP. This school is North Smyrna Elementary. All students enrolled at North Smyrna Elementary will receive free breakfast and lunch regardless of their ability to pay. The students at North will NOT be required to complete a meal benefit form.
- Smyrna Elementary and JBM are no longer eligible to participate in the CEP program. These schools no longer meet the USDA criteria required to participate in CEP.
- Any student attending Smyrna Elementary and JBM that are directly certified for free meals will receive a letter from the Child Nutrition Office. This letter will indicate the student's eligibility for free meals.
- Any parent or guardian of a child/children (enrolled at Smyrna Elementary and/or JBM) that are not directly certified will be required to complete a meal benefit form. The meal benefit forms are sent home with students at the beginning of the school year. The meal benefit form is also available on the Child Nutrition website, the school's main office, and the Child Nutrition office.






Smyrna School District Begins Using BoardDocs for Board of **Education Meetings**

SMYRNA HIGH SCHOOL PARKING POLICY/TRAFFIC FLOW

The Administration of Smyrna High School eagerly awaits the arrival of students for the Jay Davis, Career & Technology 2019-2020 school year. The east side of the building (Smyrna Side) is designated for student parking. Students who wish to drive to school will present their completed Application for Parking Permit with all supporting documents to Ms. Alicia by the National Science Foundation Bryan in the front office, along with the \$10 parking fee beginning on August 12, 2019. Only students that have completed their six month restricted driving process may purchase parking tags. Students who owe an obligation will not be allowed to purchase a parking pass until the obligations are cleared. Parking spots may not be reserved at any time. Seniors are permitted to purchase their parking tags starting on August 12 from 8:00am-3:00pm. Juniors may purchase their parking tags starting on August 13 from 8:00am-3:00pm. All remaining students may purchase a parking tag beginning August 14 from 8:00am-3:00pm. Please note that the main office will be closed on August 27 from 7:30am-1:00pm for a district-wide meeting.

All cars using the school parking lot must display the tag on the rear view mirror. Any car in the school parking lot that does not display the tag by the start of school on September 4 will be subject to towing. It is the position of the Smyrna High School Administration that driving to school is a privilege, tied to the Code of Conduct. Students who violate the Code of Conduct may have their driving privilege revoked. The Administration urges the students and parents to become familiar with the regulations associated with the driving privilege as indicated on the Application for Parking Permit.

When entering the Smyrna High School property, all traffic must enter using the West side (Clayton Side entrance) and exit the property using the East side (Smyrna side exit). Please be mindful of the 15 MPH speed limit and yield to pedestrians crossing on their way to the building. No vehicles are permitted to park in the bus lane or to drop off or pick up students in front of the school between the hours of 7:00-7:30am, and 2:15-2:45pm. The parent drop off is located on the Smyrna side of the building next to the entrance to the auditorium lobby. Please follow the driving directions provided by the signs, cones, and school personnel in that area when dropping off a student in the morning.

Smyrna School District Addresses Building Security

Starting in the 2019-2020 school year, visitors to all eight Smyrna Schools will experience a new entry process. Visitors will be able to enter the vestibule to get out of any rainy or cold weather. In the vestibule they will be asked to share the reason for their visit before they are allowed into the main office.

If the visitor is there for a valid reason, as a parent or guardian, or a meeting with a school official, or a vendor/contractor to perform some task, they will be given access to the main office. From there, they will be required to sign-in, and only then will they be allowed to enter the school, again through a secure door opened by one of the office staff.

It is recommended that you bring some form of official, government-provided identification with you when you are visiting our schools.

We know that increased security can be an inconvenience sometimes, but your children and out staff members safety is our paramount concern.



SHS Jay Davis attends STEM Educator Energy Institute

Education Specialist at Smyrna High School, joined other educators from throughout Delaware at the STEM Educator Energy Institute sponsored and the Center for Renewable Energy Advanced Technological Education. The event was held August 6-8 at Delaware Technical Community College. Participants used tools of the trade to measure the electric potential, current, and power production of solar photovoltaic panels. Educators explored fundamental solar and electrical principles and learned about energy management for smart buildings and netzero energy homes. During the Institute, participants also practiced hands-on classroom lab activities that bring energy to life for students. "The content covered during this workshop was cutting edge and certainly pertains to our students as we strive to ensure higher education and career readiness opportunities," said Davis who now oversees Career & Technology Education students and teachers at Smyrna High School. According to the Solar Foundation's National Solar Jobs Census, the solar workforce increased by 170 percent in the past seven years, from about 93,000 jobs in 2010 to more than 250,000 jobs in 2017. Although solar currently makes up less than two percent of overall US energy generation, the sector employs twice as many workers as the coal industry. The National Science Foundation's Advanced Technological Education (ATE) program supports the development of innovative approaches for educating highly skilled technicians for the industries that drive the nation's economy. Attendance Policy Highlights

ESchool Attendance is recorded for <u>every</u> class of the day. Student daily attendance will be based on the following:

Absent 1 Period = full day present

Absent 2 periods = half day absent

Absent 3-4 periods = full day absent

The Attendance Review for semester and year-long class credit will be determined using the total days Absent for each individual class. <u>Student credits will be awarded or denied for each class individually.</u>

Students will be permitted to miss up to 10 days from a semester-long class, and up to 20 days from a year-long class and still be eligible to receive academic credit for the class.

Tardy to school is for students not in the building by 7:30 AM. Three unexcused tardies will be the same as one day absent. This day of absence will count towards the total allowed absences for the year for that class. The tardies will be recorded in the main office before the student reports to class.

Tardy to class is for students 15 minutes or less late to any class of the day. The consequence is three unexcused tardies is the same as one day absent. For each unexcused tardy starting with the sixth, the student will have an additional consequence of one day in SBIP. These absences are included in the student's total allowed absences for the year and may result in credit for the course being denied.

It was another fine year, as the Smyrna FFA Chapter brought home a variety of awards and ribbons from the 100th Annual celebration of the Delaware State Fair, with numerous recognitions being presented at the Delaware FFA Awards Breakfast held on July 26, 2019.

Summer Winners & School Awards

A variety of individuals and teams were recognized at the Delaware State Fairgrounds for their outstanding performances throughout the summer months leading up to the awards breakfast.

Three members of the Smyrna High School FFA were 1st Place winners in the AgriScience Fair competition, which showcased scientific skills and analysis in the areas of agricultural research. These scientific members included: Gordon Fletcher, Heather Fletcher and Delaney Tome. Raelyn Wiley and Nick Shane also placed 2nd for their research category.

The Smyrna FFA Agricultural Issues team with their topic, "Is All Insecurity Worth All The Biosecurity?" placed 1st with team members including: Kaylee Davis, Sarah Dinsmore, Zane Kerr, Brynn Rifino and Brooke Wix. Their forum now qualifies them to compete at the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana in October. Prior to their competition, the Ag Issues team presented five community forums to the Smyrna/Clayton Holly's Club, Delaware Department of Agriculture, Kent Conservation District- NRCS & FSA Offices, the University of Delaware's Cooperative Extension Service and the Smyrna/Clayton Rotary Club.

Smyrna High School was also able to capture 1st Place in the State Agricultural Mechanics CDE with team members: Chris Marr, Aiden Pepta, Logan Strauss, and Gabe West as they were able to test their knowledge and skills in small engine troubleshooting, electrical wiring, plumbing and welding. Their efforts also ensures further competition at the National FFA Convention in the Fall.

The Livestock Evaluation Team placed 3rd in competition and was made up of members: Anthony Buhr, Cheyenne Donaghue, Maria Sterling and Austin Vendrick. This competition allows members to judge large farm animals, as well as cooperatively classify livestock as "keep" or "cull" for market and breeding purposes based on physical characteristics and records. Individual top ten placings for the team included: Maria Sterling placing 6th and Austin Vendrick placing 9th.

The Horse Evaluation CDE team placed 3th as well, with fellow members: Abby Conway, Sydney Kirch, Robin Logue and Rayne Thompson. The event consisted of judging six classes of equine, completing a team test and delivering two sets of oral reasons. Individual top ten placings for the team included: Rayne Thompson placing 6th and Abby Conway placing 8th.

The Nursery Landscape Team placed 4th in competitive action and consisted of: Gabryele Carter, Sky Jackson, Delaney Tome and Raelyn Wiley. The event was comprised of a written exam, team activity, tool and plant material identification. Individual top ten placings for the team included: Gabryele Carter placing 4th and Delaney Tome placing 9th.

Kaylee Dulin represented Smyrna FFA in the Dairy Showmanship event and placed 5th individually. The event demonstrated her skills and awareness in the show ring when working with dairy cattle.

Taylor Davis and Chris Marr drove their way to 6th and 7th place respectively in the Safe Tractor Operation CDE. This event was comprised of a written test, parts identification, using a skid steer, front end tractor loader and operating tractors with two and four wheel wagons against other statewide competitors in a course designed to test speed, accuracy and safety around obstacles.

FFA Fair Exhibits

The Smyrna FFA Chapter featured two fine chapter displays in the FFA Centre that were crafted by members: Taylor Davis, Justin Foersch, Philip Gaughan, Chris Marr and Brynn Rifino. The Delaware Agricultural Products Display placed second, only missing first by .3 points. The FFA Educational display was entitled, "I Believe In Leadership..." and will be used for future membership recruitment at Smyrna High School.

When it came to growing, designing, harvesting or building fair exhibits, there were a number of Smyrna High School FFA members who supplied competitive entries. This year the Smyrna AgriScience Program featured eleven FFA members, who were able to receive a "fair amount" in judging premiums awarded by the Delaware State Fair. 
