Essay Contest

Write about a person you admire who has the qualities of perseverance. Tell in detail why you chose this particular person, what specific qualities this person possesses, and give specific examples of how he/she demonstrates perseverance.

STUDENT WINNERS: First (gold), second (silver), and third (bronze) place winners are selected at each grade level (K-12) in each building. Winners receive medals and certificates noting their accomplishments. All winners were recognized during the “I Love the Smyrna School District” day (February 25, 2017).

My dad never gives up persevering for me or anyone at all. He is very special to me. He is the hardest worker that I know.

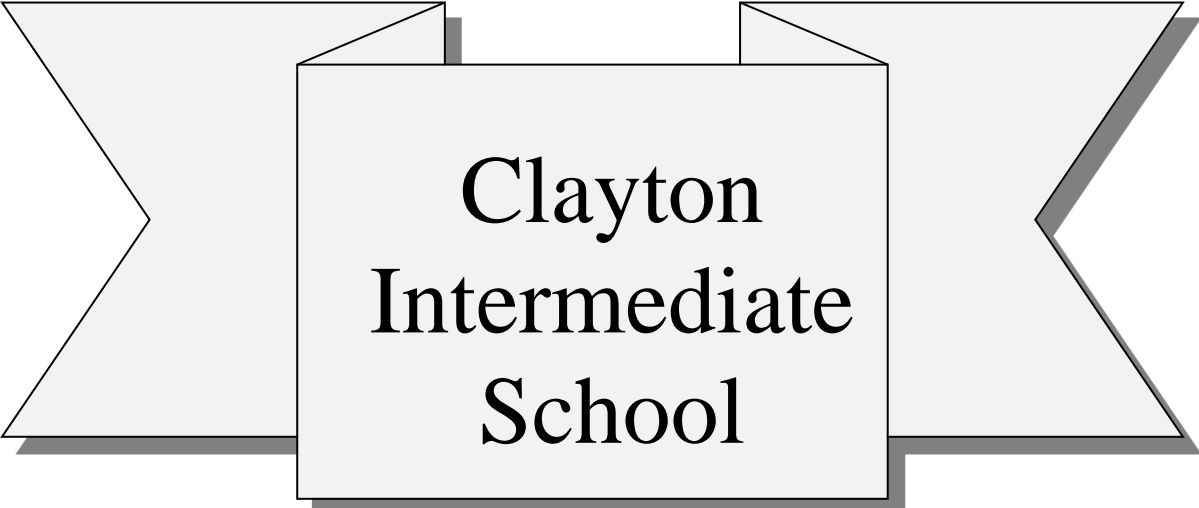

My grandma's perseverance act started when she had basic knee replacement surgery. She was in the rehabilitation section of the hospital, and about a week later, she started to get a high fever

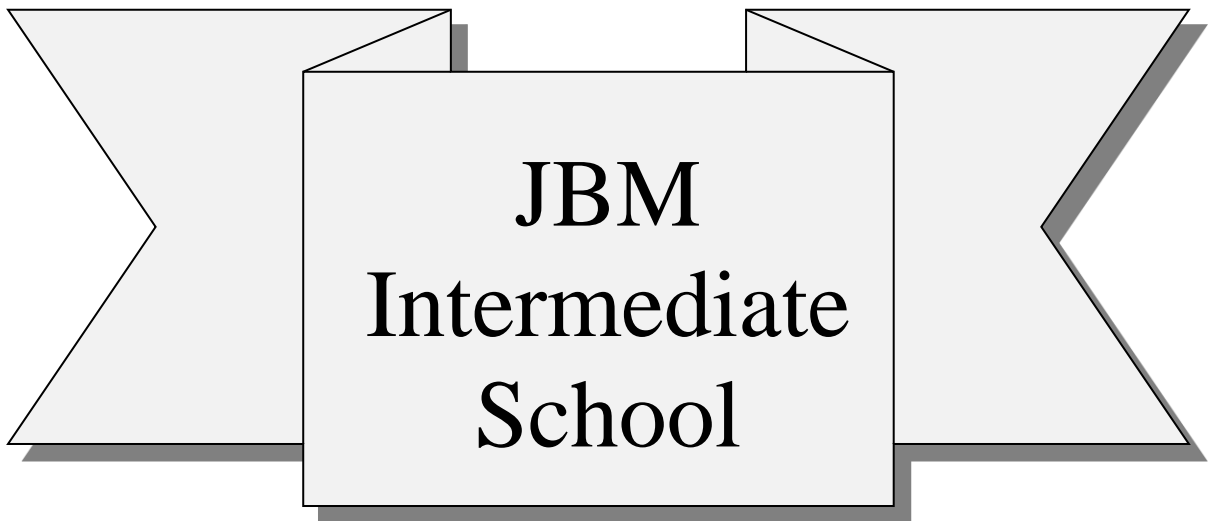

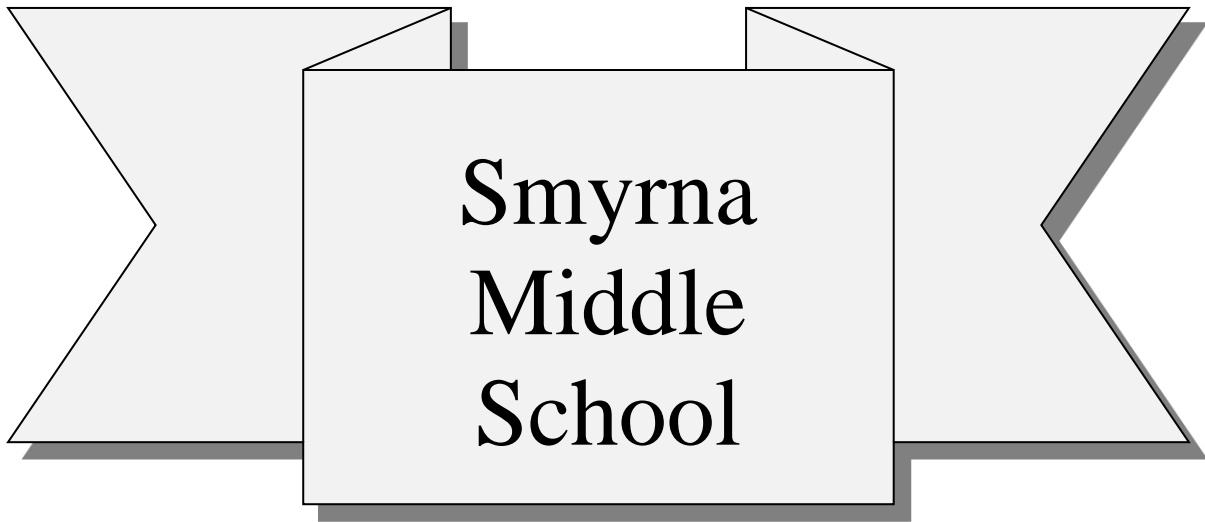

Professional soccer player Lionel Messi has said “You have to fight to reach your dream. You have to sacrifice and work hard for it.” This comment represents how he faced an obstacle and displayed perseverance. His medical battle at a young age became one of the events that changed his life. His inspiring story can help others face challenges, persevere through, and display a positive attitude to achieve their goals.

Messi, a famous soccer player, was born to Jorge and Celia Messi in Rosario, Argentina on June 24, 1987. Messi’s hard obstacle he faced was Growth Hormone Deficiency (GHD). GHD is a medical condition caused by problems arising in the pituitary gland, in which the body does not produce enough growth hormone. It is a rare condition that affects just one in every 20 million children. Growth hormone is called “somatropin” and is a polypeptide hormone which stimulates growth and cell reproduction. His development of soccer skills was viewed as amazing by his coaches, but his lack of size due to the GHD affected his game playing. At a young age, he made an important decision to face this issue.

Messi displayed perseverance by sticking with his treatments for GHD for three years. This treatment was not easy for a child. Messi said, “When I was 11 years old they discovered that I had a growth hormone deficiency and I had to start a treatment to help me to grow. Every night I had to stick a needle into my legs, night after night after night, every day of the week, and this over a period of three years.” He persevered by doing this treatment for so long, so that he could be the best soccer player he could.

All of the athletes who have faced limitations and soccer fans around the world can be inspired by Messi’s story. If he hadn’t undergone the treatment he wouldn’t have become the elite soccer player he is now. His soccer talents led him to a career in Spain in his teens. He is currently a forward with FC Barcelona and is the only football player in history to win five FIFA Ballons d’Or, and the first player to win three European Golden Shoes. He was the youngest player in history to ever score a professional league goal in 2005. He has also set records for the most goals scored in a season. He is Argentina’s all-time leading goal scorer. He had led Argentina to three final matches and got a gold medal at the 2008 summer Olympics. Lionel Messi worked hard to claim these achievements after overcoming the GHD.

Messi’s an example of perseverance of how he never gave up while facing and treating a medical condition. However, Bethany was only in the hospital for a week, and in just one month she was back to the water to surf. The board she rode was custom made. It was longer, and a little thicker than a normal board. It also had a handle for her right arm to make it easier for her to paddle. On January 2004, she entered her first major surfing competition since the accident. Since then, she has won most of the surfing competitions she has entered.

In order to persevere through her difficult times, Bethany had to depend on her family, friends and faith. Bethany has said she remembers a paramedic telling her, "God will never leave you or forsake you". Bethany's family and friends gave her encouragement and support. They helped her to never give up on her dream of returning to surfing. She has said her marriage to youth minister, Adams Dirks, and the birth of her son gives her strength to push herself. Bethany also dug deep into herself for the determination to get back on her board. She overcame the loss of an arm, fear of the water, and physical limitations. 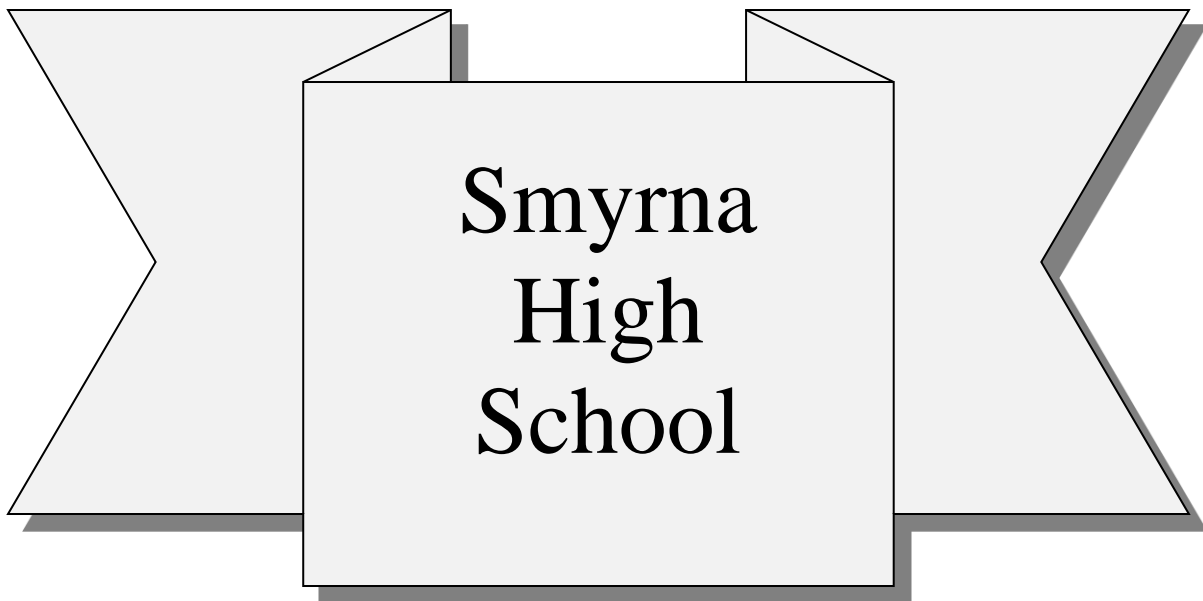

Smyrna School District defines perseverance as “the inner strength to remain constant to a purpose, idea, or task in the face of obstacles. This includes dedication, consistency and having a positive attitude.” There are those that believe that perseverance is a quality of emotionally intelligent people, and arguably that the Emotional Quotient (EQ) is more valuable than the Intelligent Quotient (IQ).
